#### Summary of Change Order for Bid Package #3

Project Location: Wood River Levee District, Madison County

Project Description: Improvements to the Wood River Levee system – Under Seepage Controls

Change Order 9 -- \$558,086.80 Increase in Contract for Relief Well Modifications

Change Order Description: Change Order 9 modifies 16 of the 18 relief wells designed in the Hartford (Hawthorne Avenue) area. The relief wells were moved to the back slope/ east side of the existing drainage district to avoid utilities in this location that were not part of the utility location records. The pipe system that will collect relief well flow has also been modified to avoid a major fiber optic bundle at the bottom of the existing ditch.

Change Order 10 -- \$509,085.18 Increase in Contract for Blanket Drain #2 Modifications

Change Order Description: Change Order 10 modifies Blanket Drain 2 due to the discovery of four existing relief wells and three existing culverts that were silted in and within the location where the new blanket drain would be constructed. The modification increases the blanket drain thickness, redesigns and modifies existing relief wells, and modifies the proposed drainage system.

### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AMENDMENT TO THE ILLINOIS WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

**WHEREAS,** the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (FWPCW) Amendments of 1972 (P.I. 92-500) and subsequent amendments set forth the framework for the establishment of the water quality management planning process; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Water Quality Management Plan was prepared in November 1982; and

**WHEREAS**, the Special Service Area #1 Committee has reviewed and recommends approval of an application to Amend the Illinois Water Quality Management Plan by transferring approximately 112 acres to the Edwardsville Facility Planning Area;

**NOW THEREFORE,** be it resolved by the Madison County Board, County of Madison, State of Illinois hereby authorizes the transfer of approximately 112 acres from the Madison County Special Service District Sub Facility Planning Area to the Edwardsville Planning Area.
