

The Madison County E-Learning Program

High School Early Leavers, Ages 17-24 may have the opportunity to earn their high school diploma or study for their GED by taking on-line classes! Our program is funded through the **Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)** thru the Department of Labor (DOL).



- Students must be WIOA eligible.
- Students may work at their own pace.
- Students may use any computer that has Internet access, even their own home computer.
- Our computer lab has a certified high school instructor available for tutoring. (M-F 8:30-4:30)
- **Diplomas are currently being issued locally by:**

Granite City School District, Alton School District,

East Alton-Wood River High School, Roxana School District,

Madison School District, Collinsville School District,

Bethalto School District and Triad High School.

- GEDs are administered and issued by Regional Office of Education
- Internet classes and materials are supplied for GED preparation
 - US and Illinois State constitution test certification are available
- Successful graduates can earn up to \$250 plus other cash incentives if they complete our three modules:
 - Diploma/ GED completion
 - Career Development/Career Plan
 - Attainment of Job Readiness Skills (entrance into college, employment, the military or an apprenticeship program)
- Work Experience opportunities are also available for a limited number of students.
